Housed under the History and Ethnic Studies department, African American Studies examines the truth and fiction regarding the African experience in the United States. In addition, African American Studies focus on the literary, musical, and artistic heritage of people of African descent leading to a heightening of self-awareness and cultural understanding for African American students.
