Student Transfer Achievement Reform (STAR) Act (SB1440)

Associate in Arts Transfer Preparation* (Major Code: 01462)

The Associate in Arts in Spanish for Transfer (AA-T) program equips both second-language learners and native speakers to engage with the Spanish-speaking world by establishing a solid foundation in the Spanish language and delving into the history, literatures, arts, cultures, and diaspora of Latin America, the Iberian Peninsula, and other Spanish-speaking territories. Throughout the program, students develop knowledge and skills that are applicable to various liberal arts disciplines. Additionally, they prepare themselves for diverse professions that involve providing services or products to Spanish-speaking communities. Upon successfully completing the Associate in Arts in Spanish for Transfer (AA-T) program, students will possess a strong academic foundation in the field, positioning themselves for advanced studies at the upper division baccalaureate level.

Program Student Learning Outcome

 Initiate, sustain and close a variety of uncomplicated communicative tasks in the target language, and handle social situations in a culturally sensitive and collegial manner.

The following is required for all AA-T or AS-T degrees:

- Completion of minimum 60 semester or 90 quarter units of transferable degree applicable courses.
- Minimum overall grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in all transferable coursework, including a minimum "C" grade (or "Pass") required in each course for Cal-GETC.
- Minimum 18 semester or 27 quarter units in major or area of emphasis with a minimum grade of "C" (or "Pass") for each course in the major
- Completion of the <u>California General Education Transfer Curriculum</u> (<u>Cal-GETC</u>) pattern.

SDSU Note: San Diego State University (SDSU) accepts this ADT for transferring into the Spanish BA major. Check SDSU Transfer Pathways (https://admissions.sdsu.edu/transfers/transfer-pathways/) and consult with an academic counselor.
