Develops a comprehensive understanding of history, theory, and the technical skills necessary to develop believable characters and fluid scenes. Prepares students to transfer to a college or university for further training, to seek entry level jobs in the industry, to apprentice, or to utilize their creative skills in amateur, community, commercial, industrial, or professional theatre, film, and television productions.

- Articulate their process of creating character and building relationships in scenes.
- · Create believable characters.
- Analyze the stylistic elements of dramatic works including plot, beats, character development and given circumstances.
