CALIFORNIA GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (CAL-GETC)

2025-2026

University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) Requirements

The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) is the 34 unit singular general education pathway for California Community College (CCC) students to fulfill lower-division general education requirements necessary for transfer and admission to both the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC).

A minimum "C" grade is required in each college course for Cal-GETC. A "C" is defined as a minimum of 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale. A "C-" grade valued at less than 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale cannot be used for Cal-GETC certification. Only full Cal-GETC Certification may be forwarded to the CSU or UC. Students wishing to use a course to meet Cal-GETC requirements must assure that the course is approved for the academic year in which it was taken.

Important Exceptions:

- Cal-GETC Certification Using Pre-Fall 2025 IGETC Courses: Students
 who completed IGETC-approved courses prior to Fall 2025, including
 courses that are no longer active in assist.org, may apply those
 courses in the same Cal-GETC area(s) for certification.
- IGETC Certification Using Cal-GETC Courses: Students seeking IGETC certification may use Cal-GETC-approved courses in the same area(s) —whether newly created or newly approved as of Fall 2025.

The Cal-GETC plan is not the only way to fulfill lower-division general education requirements, nor will its completion guarantee admission to a CSU or UC campus. Depending on a student's major or field of study, the student may find it advantageous to fulfill the CSU's general education requirements or those of the UC campus or college to which the student plans to transfer. Some colleges within the UC system may not accept Cal-GETC. Each UC campus program and major has different rules and requirements.

It is recommended for students completing Cal-GETC consult with an academic counselor to determine which general education pattern is the most appropriate and refer to university catalog of choice for further information.
